PARENT/STUDENT INFORMATION 2023

- The Duke of Edinburgh Award (DEA) is an International Award program which provides young people between the ages
 of 14-25 years the opportunity to experience a sense of personal achievement through individual challenge, team work
 and fun. Young people who take part in this award experience real connection to both their immediate and global
 communities. The Award will empower them to become future leaders and true global citizens.
- The award is run upon the guidelines set down by the Duke of Edinburgh's Award and is designed to individually challenge you in a noncompetitive way, encouraging personal growth, perseverance and commitment.
- There are three levels to the program: Bronze, Silver and Gold and four components to each level:
 - Service: Volunteering time to assist others or your community
 - Physical Recreation: Improving fitness and discovering new sports or active recreational activity
 - Skills: Undertake a new interest or hobby or extending on a current one
 - Adventurous Journey: This is the only section of The Award required to be undertaken in a group.
 Undertaking a journey in an unfamiliar environment is about creating opportunities for team building through shared planning, role allocation, problem solving and accommodating physical and personality differences.
 There are two adventurous journeys Practice & Qualifying.
- The first 3 components require each participant to choose and personally organize their activities whilst the adventurous journey / expedition component is planned in conjunction with the Brigidine coordinator and an external operator (a professional/qualified outdoor education group).
- All activities are extracurricular and voluntary.

- Attached you will find an outline of expedition dates for 2023. It is a requirement that registered students participate in both the practice and qualifying expeditions.
- An Expedition Fee will apply for the expedition components.
- **Expedition Fees** shown below are the expected all-up charge for 2023 but may be subject to minor changes once student registrations are completed:
 - BRONZE: \$900 Preliminary Training Day; two expeditions consisting of 1 night and two days each. Includes equipment hire. The Fee will be invoiced in early Term 1 and may be paid in full, or by setting up an instalment plan through to the end of Term 2.
 - SILVER: \$1,100 Two expeditions consisting of 2 nights and 3 days each. Includes equipment hire. The Fee will
 be invoiced in early Term 1 and may be paid in full, or by setting up an instalment plan through to the end of
 Term 2.
 - GOLD Option 1: \$1,350 Two expeditions consisting of 4 days and three nights each, plus a travel day as
 required. The Fee will be invoiced in early Term 3 and may be paid in full, or by setting up an instalment plan
 through to the end of Term 4.
 - GOLD Fiji Option: \$700 One qualifying expedition consisting of 4 days and three nights, plus a travel day as required. This fee will be invoiced in Term 4.
- Students who participant in the Fiji Experience will pay fees directly to the travel provider Worn Gundidj.

 The Tour fee of \$5,300 is an indicative price only, and subject to changes according to registration numbers, exchange rates and other factors. Further information will follow.



- In 2023 girls will have the choice of their mode of transport for expeditions. They may select to hike or canoe. All participants at all levels will need to indicate their preferred expedition type on the registration form. When deciding please consider the following:
 - Girls who to do Bronze will complete the practice expedition the day prior to and during the school camp. This is only applicable at a Year 9 Bronze level.
 - All expeditions will be conducted on set dates as listed on the attachment so please consider the weather if you are wishing to canoe, these will not be in peak summer. When choosing expedition dates please only consider weekend dates during term time if you are prepared to be in attendance at school every day the following week, no absentees following an expedition will be accepted. It is definitely not in the spirit of Duke of Edinburgh Award.
- The College will not be able to offer alternate dates for expeditions so please take note of these dates. If a student cannot attend these expeditions, they will be put in touch with an external provider who will allow them to join a community camp group for the expedition as organized by the student and a credit will be given for that expedition cost.
- An Information Evening with more details for Parents and Students is planned for **Thursday 9**th **February 2023** to provide a complete overview of the program. This will be an opportunity to hear from a Land's Edge Foundation representative, as well as learn more about the benefits and structure of the award.

I understand that the Award Unit has the discretion to determine whether the Award requirements have been met and therefore whether Bronze, Silver or Gold Award should be issued. I understand that the National Award Authority provides Participants with limited insurance in respect of personal accident and public liability (insurance) commencing upon acceptance into The Duke of Ed by the Award Unit.
